

Adir Hu: Singing to G-d for Redemption

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1. Pesach Haggadah, “Adir Hu”

אדר' הוא יונה ביתו בקרוב. מחרה, בימיו בקרוב, כל בנה, פנה בימה בקרוב.

Mighty is He, may He build His house soon. Quickly, quickly, in our days, soon. G-d build, G-d build, build Your house soon.

- *Why do we ask for the Beit HaMikdash on Seder night?*

2. Talmud, Rosh HaShanah 11b (Koren translation)

רבי יהושע אומר: בניו עתידין ליגאל. אבל גורא ליל שגורר. "ליל המשורב בכא משחת נמי בראשית".

Rabbi Yehoshua says: In Nisan our forefathers were redeemed from Egypt; and in Nisan in the future the Jewish people will be redeemed in the final redemption. The Gemara asks: From where do we derive that the final redemption will be in Nisan? **The verse states:** “It is a night of watching for the Lord for bringing them out from the land of Egypt; this is the Lord’s night of watching, for all the children of Israel throughout their generations” (Exodus 12:42). This teaches that the night of Passover is a **night that has been continuously watched**, i.e., set aside for the purpose of redemption, **from the six days of Creation**, and it will continue to be so until the final redemption.

Problem	Answer of Adir Hu
<p>We may not build the Beit HaMikdash on Yom Tov.</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">אדיר הוא יבנה ביתו</p> <p>The Mighty One (i.e., G-d) will build His house (i.e., the Third Beit HaMikdash) Himself (Rashi to Sukkah 41a).</p> <p>Therefore, we sing...</p> <p style="text-align: right;">"קל, בנה!"</p> <p>"G-d, build!"</p>
<p>G-d swore to never again allow us into His resting place (i.e., the Beit HaMikdash).</p>	<p>The Third Beit HaMikdash will be built [anew] by G-d, and therefore, not subject to His oath concerning the first two Temples.</p> <p>Therefore, we sing...</p> <p style="text-align: right;">"קל, בנה!"</p> <p>"G-d, build!"</p>

G-d “divorced” us; consequently, we may not reside in the same neighbourhood.

- There was never divorce between G-d and us; merely a separation ([Yeshayahu 50:1](#), [Yirmiyahu 3:1](#)). We long to return to G-d’s “house” (i.e., the Beit HaMikdash).

Therefore, we sing...

"בְּנֵה בַּיִתְךָ בְּקָרֹב!"

“...build Your house soon!”

- G-d can never divorce us permanently; He must take us back *eventually*, since He “compelled” us to accept the Torah (based on [Shabbat 88a](#), [Devarim 22:29](#)).

Therefore, we sing...

"בְּנֵה בַּיִתְךָ בְּקָרֹב!"

“...build Your house **soon!**”
