How can we bring mixed-up korbanos without semichah?

• Ray Yosef – These are korbanos of women

#### 75a

- Abbaye But we use korbanos from mixtures of communal/individual; based on context those are of men!
  - Live mixtures 4 from each: at least 1 from each: bedieved 4 from all
  - Dead mixtures 4 from each; at least 1 from each
  - o Rebbe If the single matanah has enough for all it represents, fine
- Rava: All of those cases are post-semichah. "Live" = Mixed cups, "Dead" = Mixed blood

By the way: Does Rebbe really require that the matanah be that large? 75b

- We learned re: מי חשאת that fell in other water, that per Rebbe, R' Eliezer does not require a shiur from each!
  - That's within R' Eliezer
  - Hazaah is different from Zerikah

We said "If a korban is mixed with bechor/maaser, wait for a mum, eat it like bechor/maaser"

- [Bechoros 33a Machlokes Beit Hillel/Beit Shammai re: eating a blemished bechor with טומאה היוצאת מגופו
- What is the status of temuras bechor tam? Rava: Just like Bechor
- If I dedicate a blemished bechor to bedek habayis, do we prioritize Pseida or Zilzul?
  - Argument 1: In the mixture case we prioritize zilzul!
    - No: That would be a case of zilzul bechor to avoid pseida of korban
  - o Argument 2: Cannot be matpis a bechor tam
    - No: No comparison to a d'oraysa!
    - But see Tosafot התפיס
  - Argument 3: Kohen only dedicated that which was eligible for him

# We said "All can mix, except chatas with asham [talui]"

Olah	Male
Chatas Nasi	Male goat
Chatas Yachid	Female goat, female sheep
Asham	Female goat, female sheep, birds
Asham Talui	Ram
Asham Nazir, Asham Metzora	Male lamb

Mishnah: If an asham is mixed with a shelamim, what do you do?

- R' Shimon Treat both as asham
- Chachamim Don't bring shelamim to psul (rather, let it get a mum)

The concern for bringing kodshim to psul (Rashi, Chacham Tzvi, Rambam)

Mishnah: If pieces are mixed with other pieces, can only treat both in the strictest way
