- 1. If there are no kosher restaurants nearby, may I enter a non-kosher establishment to drink a cup of coffee, or soda? May I assume that Starbucks coffee is okay?
- 2. May I buy kosher fish in a non-kosher fish store? And if I can how do I go about arranging it?
- 3. May I go into an ordinary store (example: supermarket, fruit store) and buy a cut watermelon? Can I eat cut fruit at a hotel that does not have a hashgacha?
- 4. Must I have separate dishwashers for meat and dairy?
- 5. How can I kasher a non-kosher dishwasher?
- 6. May I wash pareve dishes in the dishwasher after using it for meat or dairy dishes?
- 7. Must I have separate stove tops for meat and dairy pots?
- 8. May I cook on a non-kosher stove top (example: at a rented vacation home, apartment)?
- 9. What is the זין if something hot falls on the middle of the stove?
- 10. How can I kasher the grates on my stove?
- 11. May a regular household oven be used for meat and dairy one after another or at the same time?
- 12. May a toaster oven be used for meat and dairy? May a microwave?
- 13. How can I kasher an oven that was used for non-kosher food? How is a microwave oven koshered?
- 14. If I stay at a hotel, may I heat/cook my food in the oven?
- 15. May kosher food be heated in a clean, non-kosher microwave oven (e.g., at work)? Does it need to be covered?
- 16. Can you trust your gentile maid to cook for you in your kosher kitchen and not make something טריף if you turn on the flame on the stove?
- 17. If I cook food in a pot that has not yet been toyeled, is the food forbidden?
- 18. May I eat from a vessel that was not toveled if it belongs to another Jew?
- 19. May I order/deliver non-kosher food for a Jewish employer? What about a non-Jewish

employer?

- 20. May I cook meat and milk together in a cookery class with no intention of eating it? What about chicken and milk?
- 21. May I use a meat vessel for dairy or a non-kosher vessel for kosher food if the vessel is clean and the food cold?
- 22. I use my kitchen table for serving dairy. Must I put down a tablecloth before serving meat on this table?
- 23. If I cooked בן יומו (which remains sharp) in a meat pot that isn't בר חריף, and then I mix it with a dairy spoon, what is the status of the food, the pot and the spoon?
- 24. What happens if milk spilled onto meat?
- 25. What happens if a hot piece of meat falls onto a cold non-kosher sink? What about the stove top?
- 26. Milk was mistakenly cooked in a clean meat pot. What is the status of the milk and of the pot?
- 27. I cut cold cheese with a meat knife. What is the status of the cheese and of the knife?
- 28. What is a דבר חריף?

What about radish, garlic, onion, leek, horseradish, olives, lemons, apples, plums, pickles, sauerkraut, herring, brine, whiskey, vinegar, olive oil, wine.

- 29. What is the status of דבר חריף if it is cooked or fried (i.e. fried onions)?
- 30. Milk splashed near a hot meat pot, but I am not sure any milk touched the pot. Is the pot permitted?
- 31. What happens if a drop of milk falls onto the outside of a hot pot of meat on the fire? What if it falls on the cover?
- 32. What happens if a drop of milk falls on the outside of a hot empty pareve pot?
- 33. What happens if a hot dairy pot cover which was just removed from a pot of milk is placed on a cold pot containing meat?
- 34. What is the כלי שני of a כלי שני with regard to בשר בחלב What is considered? What is the status of a ladle?
- 35. How do we hold by a דבר גוש? What is a דבר גוש?

- 36. How do we hold regarding גפסק הקילות?
- 37. What types of foods are ראוי for removing כדי קליפה?
- 38. A dairy spoon was used to stir hot milk in a pot on the fire and was then washed. After some time had elapsed, this spoon was inserted by mistake into a meat pot on the fire. What is the law? What if the milk was heated in a כלי שני ?
- 39. By mistake, I sliced a hot piece of meat with a dairy knife that had been used to cut hot cheese within 24 hours. Are the knife and meat forbidden?
- 40. If non-kosher food falls into hot kosher food, under what conditions is the resultant mixture permitted?
- 41. A cup of coffee with milk spilled into a pot of chicken soup. For the soup to be permitted, must it have 60 times the volume of the whole cup of coffee or only of the milk?
- 42. After cooking meat and potatoes, I discovered insects in the pot. What is the law?
- 43. A fly fell into the soup. What should I do?
- 44. May I use glass utensils for meat and dairy? What about pyrex?
- 45. Non-kosher food was cooked in a glass pot. Is the pot forbidden?
- 46. By mistake, potatoes were cooked in a clean pot that had been used for cooking non-kosher food. May I eat the potatoes? Can we assume that it wasn't בן יומו
- 47. May I cook potatoes in a clean meat pot which is אינו בן יומר, if I intend to eat the potatoes with butter? If I cooked the potatoes in the pot already can I put butter on?
- 48. I cooked fish in a clean pot that had been used within 24 hours to cook meat. May I reheat the fish in a pareve pot? May I reheat it in a dairy pot that was used within 24 hours to cook milk?
- 49. Sharp pareve spicy food was cooked in a clean meat pot that had not been used for 24 hours. Less than 24 hours later, I cooked dairy in that pot by mistake. Are the dairy and the pot permitted?
- 50. While vegetables were cooking in a ben yomo meat pot, a clean dairy spoon was inserted into the pot. What is the halachic status of the vegetables, the pot, and the spoon if the spoon is ben yomo? What if the spoon is not ben yomo?
- 51. I cooked kosher meat in a pot that had been used to cook non-kosher food within the previous 24 hours. This meat was later recooked in a kosher pot. Must the second pot be kashered?

52. Must I have separate sinks for washing meat and dairy dishes? Do I need separate basins? Do I need separate sponges? Do I need separate drying racks?

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- 53. By mistake I put meat and dairy dishes in the same sink, and then added hot water. Are the dishes and sink אסור? Does it matter if the dishes were clean or dirty? What if you add soap to the pile of dishes before adding the hot water?
- 54. What is the law if a דבר הריף was cut with a meat knife? Can dairy be eaten with the הריף What if the דבר הריף is cooked with dairy? What if you place the יהריף in a food processor, does it make the processor into meat? Do you need to wait six hours after eating the דבר הריף before eating milk?
- 55. An onion was cut into small pieces with a dairy knife and then cooked with chicken soup by mistake. Is the chicken soup permitted?
- 56. A clean non-kosher spoon which had been used for hot non-kosher food within the last 24 hours was inserted into horseradish. Is the horseradish forbidden? What if it was a clean meat spoon, is the horseradish meat?
- 57. Must I have separate salt and pepper shakers for meat and dairy? Do I need separate ketchup containers?
- 58. Can you heat up פרווה soup in a meat בן יומו pot and then later on heat it up again in a dairy בן יומו pot? What if the pots are not ben yomo?
- 59. A non-kosher pot became mixed with the kosher pots. What is the law? Does it depend where they are found (sink, dish rack, drawer)?
- 60. Must I check eggs for blood spots before preparing them? What if I mixed an egg into a dish which contained a blood spot, is the dish still כשר?
- 61. Do disposable aluminum pans require טבילת כלים if the pan is used more than once? What if they are not used more than once?
- 62. I cut an onion with a meat knife on a dairy cutting board. What is the status of the onion, knife and cutting board? What if the cutting board was pareve with a meat knife and vice versa?
