Hashem promised Moshe that the elders would believe him, but did not mention all the people would. Or perhaps Moshe thought they would hear him but not believe him. הנה השם אמר שיאמינו בו הזקנים רק לא הזכיר ככה .כי ושמעו לקולך אולי לא יאמינו בלב.

It is also plausible to explain that Moshe thought that perhaps it was due to his defect that Bnai Yisrael did not listen to him, for he had "sealed lips" and therefore, not suited to speak convincingly to them. Moshe thought even more so this would be true, if he would speak to Paroh.

## Rav Samson Raphael Hirsch Shemot 6:12

12 אל הי חדבר משה לסני הי. This expression does not occur elsewhere in the Torah except in verse 30 (below), where Moshe repeats this argument. Moshe expresses it not to God, but to himself, and God, as it were, overhears it. It was his natural mood and his natural doubts that involuntarily escaped him.

מבר שפחים exceeds מרל שפחים (above, 4:10). That phrase denotes merely a clumsiness of speech, whereas יורל is one who has no control over the faculty with which he is naturally endowed (cf. Commentary, Bereshis 17:10). Moshe is saying: "Even if I overcome the clumsiness of my vocal organs, I still lack the actual power of speech, the right words fail me. As much as I would like to announce glorious tidings to the people, and inspire them and uplift them, the power to do so fails me; I do not have the ability, and I fail, as I have just experienced."
